Defining a Zettelkasten

- German: "slip-box" or "note-box"
- A study method created by Conrad Gessner (1500s)
- Series of short notes
 - Each note has a unique ID
 - Notes can be organized not just as topics and subtopics, but as flexibly linked notes
- Previously impractical due physical papers

Benefits

- Students learn by writing, organizing and restructuring information
- This process mimics neural network development

Drawbacks

- Requires access to applications
- Requires consistent usage

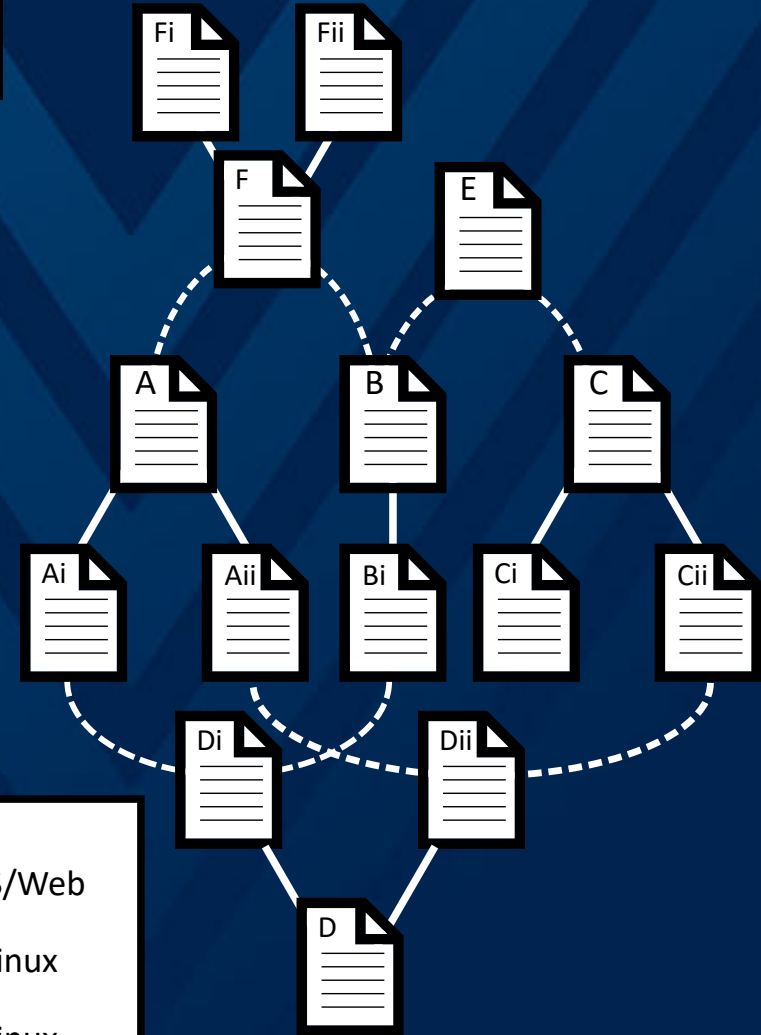
